INDEPENDENCE: Spread Your Wings

<u>Biking to School</u>: We love that our bike racks are filled each morning with so many students choosing to start their morning with independence and exercise! We would like to remind our students to obey the rules of the road, particularly in the crossing of Meadowbank Road.

- Students should dismount their bikes and cross at the lights when the "Walk" sign is activated.
- Students should avoid the Independent Grocery store parking lot and use Hilltop Avenue from Meadowbank.
- HELMETS are MANDATORY by law.
- As well, our staff are not on duty before 8:05am, so please know that students that arrive before that time are not supervised.

<u>Battery Challenge</u>: Once again, we are participating in the Call2Recycle Battery challenge. We have been defending PEI champions in this contest for more than 5 years, help us make this our best year yet. In 2022, we collected 3083 kgs. In 2023, we collected 2470.75 kgs and last year, we collected <u>3237 kgs!</u>. All prize money will go towards our outdoor learning space.
