Winter Wellness Day: Is officially on Friday, February 16th. Grade 6 students will be offered the opportunity to go to Brookvale skiing that day (permission slips and information already sent home). There will be outdoor activities planned for Grade 4 and 5 students at school during that day. Please ensure that your child comes to school with all necessary items for being outside for a large portion of the day.

**Early Morning Sports**: Early morning sports at ERES will continue this month. There has been a great turn out every day. A reminder that all students are welcome. There's no sign up needed and they can choose which days they would like to attend. They can come all three if they would like!

- Start time is 7:30 a.m. Students cannot be dropped off before 7:30 a.m. as staff need to be onsite to accept them.
- Entrance for students will be the side door between the gym and activity room. Please enter the school via Main Street/Terry Fox Place and drop off your child at our drop off location. Students will walk down the long sidewalk (along our construction zone) to the entrance.

If school is cancelled or delayed, there will be no early morning sports that day.

Grade 4 Superflex Program: Our Behaviour Resource Teacher (Darren Ford) and Youth Service Worker (Valerie Acorn) have begun working with our grade 4 classes on the Superflex program. The goal of this curriculum is to provide a fun, motivating way to improve our students' social and behavioural flexibility and to ultimately develop better self monitoring and self feedback loops for their social behaviour. The concept of the program is that we all have a superhero (Superflex) in our brains and he constantly has to battle the "Team of Unthinkables" who are a variety of unexpected behaviours. The program fits perfectly with the Social Emotional Learning our school is continuing to focus on. The classes will participate in these lessons (two 30 minute sessions during a 6 day cycle) for approximately the next 10 weeks. As the lessons progress, they will provide opportunities for students to learn about the different "Unthinkable" characters while building on their ability to recognize these behaviours in themselves and others. In addition, they will learn and practice using "Superflex Strategies" to overcome and alter their responses and actions when the "Unthinkables" make an appearance.

Attendance: A reminder that the PSB Engagement and Attendance Policy

Our hope is that together we can help our children make safe, healthy and responsible choices when engaging in online behaviours.
- Understanding your Brain Parent Presentation Thorsday May 2nd, 2024 at 6:30pm This presentation will provide parents with a snapshot of the psychoeducation that is taught to students that deals with the physiological response to emotions. Our hope is that together we can support children when they have challenging emotions by giving them knowledge about what is happening in their bodies, the language to support their understanding, and the tools to help them better regulate their emotions.

**School Cancellations**: All Public Schools Branch (PSB) weather-related cancellations will be announced on local radio stations and posted on the PSB website by 7:00 am with an announcement that "all classes in the public schools branch are cancelled" means that there is no school for students. An announcement of a "system-wide shutdown" indicates that all schools and offices are closed. In some instances, it may only be necessary to close an individual school or a Family of Schools. Partial system closures or delays will be announced by Family of Schools. Please remember we are in the Bluefield Family of Schools.

One Hour Delay: If a decision on cancellation cannot be made by 7:00 am, a one-hour delay will be announced whereby all schools and buses will operate one hour later than usual. A further announcement will be broadcast by 8:00 am.

<u>Late Busses</u>: In some instances, even in fine weather, buses may be delayed. Parents will be notified via radio broadcast that a bus will be delayed (i.e. Bus #92 is running 30 minutes late).

School Closure During the Day: It may be necessary to close school partway through a school day. Detailed announcements will be made on local radio stations and posted to the PSB website as early as possible. We will send an email as soon as we know. We will follow your child's early closure plan, unless you arrive at the school to pick up your child before we dismiss. Please understand that our phone lines become very busy and we are often tied up contacting bus drivers etc, so calling the school to change your child's plan is not recommended.
