This month's quote is a good reminder for those of us parenting kids in the middle school years. At this age, children start to forge a bit of independence and identity separate from parents. New friends, opinions and thoughts that may differ from ours as children grow and start to define themselves as individuals. As parents, this can be hard and unsettling, but as Jessica Lahey reminds us:

The process of separating from us began for our children the moment we set them down on the kitchen floor and they took their first steps away from us. Every milestone - first step, first word, first day of school, first date - marks the stages of the journey toward an independent life. Our job is not to protect them from their failures along the way, but to help them cope with setbacks

as they occur, because when they move out of their childhood home and begin to forge their own path, they are going to need all the resources and tools we can give them." Pg. 159

#### PEERS® - Program for the Education & Enrichment of Relations Skills

PEERS® is an evidence based program that has been field tested extensively for youth with ASD. PEERS® is a 16 week group based program that supports high functioning youth with ASD who want to make friends and socialize but may be having difficulty making and keeping friends and managing peer conflict and rejection. Lessons include: having two way conversations, entering and exiting conversations, electronic forms of communication, choosing appropriate friends, using humor appropriately, being a good sport, having successful get togethers, managing arguments with friends, and handling teasing, physical bullying and other forms of social rejection. Each weekly session includes a review from the previous week, role playing, activities and a homework assignment.
