You will need to re-register as this is our first set of conferences this year. To register for an account, click on the "REGISTER" tab on the top of the website. You can register anytime, but booking for appointments will be open on Sunday November 12 at 8am and will close on Friday November 17th at 10 pm. If you are unable to find a suitable time, please reach out to your child's teacher to set up an alternate time.

Scholastic Book Fair: We will be having a Scholastic Book Fair in school starting on Tuesday November 21st until Friday November 24th. It will be located in the library. The Book Fair is open during the school day and your child's class will be visiting the book fair at a time selected by their teacher. The Book Fair will also be open after school until 4:30 and on Thursday evening until 8:30 for Parent Conferences. We close the Book Fair on Friday at 1:00pm to allow enough time for packing up all the books. Proceeds from the Book Fair go towards purchasing new books for our school library.

<u>Battery Challenge Update</u>: 151 boxes have been shipped to Call2Recycle so far! That's about 6000 lbs of batteries and 4 more boxes than we collected last Fall. School winners will be announced later this Fall, but we are hopeful we will be one of the top three. Over the last few years, we have been putting our prize money towards the build of our future outdoor learning space.

<u>Coupon Books</u>: Thank you for your support for another successful coupon book campaign. Funds raised by our coupon books each year go towards programs, resources, and activities for our students. Our coupon books should be here by the end of the week and we will have them organized and ready to go home early next week.

<u>Terry Fox Update:</u> Thank you for your support of another amazing Terry Fox run! Our school was able to raise \$6030.15 for cancer research and we had a great run at our school in beautiful weather in September.

<u>Cross Country Update</u>: Eliot River had outstanding representation at the Provincial Cross Country Meet on October 21st. We placed 5th in the province in Novice Boys (Grade 5 and 6), and came in first for both the Novice (Grades 5-6) and Pre-Novice (Grades 3-4) Girls divisions. Double Provincial Champions! Special congratulations to our top three runners, Stella Brioux (1st in pre-Novice), Evy Brioux (3rd in Novice) and Daniel Grandy (9th in Novice). <u>Dressing for the Weather:</u> a reminder that our students go outside in all kinds of weather for recess and activities, including light rain/drizzle. We want all of our students and staff to stay healthy and well.

School Cancellations: All Public Schools Branch (PSB) weather-related cancellations will be announced on local radio stations and posted on the PSB website by 7:00 am with an announcement that "all classes in the public schools branch are cancelled" means that there is no school for students. An announcement of a "system-wide shutdown" indicates that all schools and offices are closed. In some instances, it may only be necessary to close an individual school or a Family of Schools. Partial system closures or delays will be announced by Family of Schools. Please remember we are in the Bluefield Family of Schools.

One Hour Delay: If a decision on cancellation cannot be made by 7:00 am, a one-hour delay will be announced whereby all schools and buses will operate one hour later than usual. A further announcement will be broadcast by 8:00 am.

<u>Late Busses</u>: In some instances, even in fine weather, buses may be delayed. Parents will be notified via radio broadcast that a bus will be delayed (i.e. Bus #92 is running 30 minutes late).

School Closure During the Day: It may be necessary to close school partway through a school day. Detailed announcements will be made on local radio stations and posted to the PSB website as early as possible. We will send an email as soon as we know. We will follow your child's early closure plan, unless you arrive at the school to pick up your child before we dismiss. Please understand that our phone lines become very busy and we are often tied up contacting bus drivers etc, so calling the school to change your child's plan is not recommended.
