<u>Pick Up/Drop Off during the school day</u>: A reminder that if you are picking up or dropping off your child during the day, you can still park by the blue shed (off Terry Fox Place) and take the sidewalk along the construction zone to our side door. Once inside, follow the hallway down to our main office. All students leaving early or being dropped off late need to be signed in and out of our main office.

<u>Safe Arrivals</u>: With many of our students walking to school, or catching a bus after parents have left for work in the morning, we have a safe arrival procedure in place. To help us ensure everyone is safe, please notify the school if your child is going to be absent. You can call in the absence after 8am (902-368-4270) or email the school. If you are emailing your child's teacher, it would be great if you could copy our Admin Assistant, Krista (kayoung@edu.pe.ca) in case the teacher is absent that day. We will be following up with families via email if their child is "absent-unexcused" each morning.

Scream Park: We are pleased to be able to host the return of our annual Scream Park on Wednesday October 25th, 2023. The light hearted theme for our younger audience will take place from 5:30-7pm, with the scary theme going from 7:30-9pm. Admission is a minimum donation of \$2 to support our Phys Ed program. The Thriller dance group will be attending and accepting monetary donations for the local food bank. <u>Grade 5 Friendship Presentations</u>: Over the next month or so, Grade 5 students will be given an opportunity to learn more about friendship and continue to develop our positive school community and culture. The Youth Service Worker (Valerie Acorn) will be visiting the classes to work with classroom teachers to discuss and explore the following topics: skills needed to develop friendships and make friends, how to be a friend, navigating conflicts in friendships, and understanding more than one point of view. This work aligns well with our Health Curriculum at Grade 5.

<u>Scent Policy:</u> All schools in the Public Schools Branch follow a scent free policy. https://psb.edu.pe.ca/sites/psb.edu.pe.ca/files/2022-05/604 Scented Products and Fragrances.pdf Please be cognizant of any scented deodorant, laundry, shampoo and any other products that your child may be wearing to school. We want all of our students and staff to stay healthy and well.

<u>Forks, Spoons and Water Bottles</u>: a reminder that forks and spoons are not provided by the provincial lunch, so if you are ordering, you must send utensils with your child on those days. The school does not supply these from an environmental standpoint. As well, students must bring a filled water bottle each day to school. Our water bottle filling stations and classroom sinks are available for refilling throughout the day.

<u>School Occupational Health:</u> Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! This letter is to inform you that the School Therapy Occupational Therapy Program will be at Eliot River Elementary School this school year. Occupational Therapists (OTs) are regulated health professionals who work with children

in many different settings and who know a lot about motor development, sensory processing as well as environmental set up, adaptations and accessibility. OTs support students in schools with participating in

- Personal cares: bathroom routines, putting on and removing outdoor clothing and footwear, clothing fasteners (e.g., snaps, zippers, buttons, shoelaces), opening and closing lunch containers, feeding self, etc.
- Classroom and school routines: transitioning between activities or spaces within the classroom or school, organizing and locating school materials, participating in classroom routines, participating in Phys Ed, library, music, recess, and playground activities, etc.
- Learning-based activities: using classroom tools (e.g., scissors, pencils, glue stick, learning manipulatives, etc.), expressing learning through cutting, colouring, drawing, printing, cursive writing and using technology, self regulation with respect to focusing attention and starting work in a timely manner, etc.
- Managing sensory demands of a school environment: managing the sound of the bell and /or announcements, sounds and movement in busy corridors, echo in the gym, sounds during assemblies, lighting in the school, feel of learning materials, etc.
- Managing the physical environment: accessing spaces when using mobility aids (e.g., wheelchairs, walkers, etc.), accessing appropriate classroom desk and chair heights, using flexible seating options and optimal learning spaces, using equipment for personal cares and technical access (e.g., change tables, lift systems, switches for environmental controls or communication devices), etc.

The OT will be part of the school team and accessible to all school staff as well as to parents/guardians. While at the school, the OT will spend time in many areas of the school (i.e., classrooms, gym, music, playground, etc.) and will observe students participating in their school activities. The OT will guide school staff in understanding how they can use activities within the classroom to help children with their motor skills and sensory processing.

If the OT, together with your child's teacher, notice your child is having difficulty in the above-mentioned areas the teacher will contact you to discuss making an individual referral to the School Therapy OT Program. If you have questions or concerns about your child in the above-mentioned areas, please feel free to contact the OT at Eliot River Elementary School as well as your child's classroom teacher.

If a family doctor, pediatrician, or other health agency would like your child to be seen by the School Therapy, OT program, the referral request must be communicated to both you as well as your child's school to start the referral process.

If your child is currently being seen by private OT and you and your child's school team would like to refer your child to the School Therapy OT Program, please feel free to contact the OT at Eliot River Elementary School to discuss the transition from private OT to the School Therapy, OT Program.

- 1. What is Home & School? David Schult, Former international school teacher and administrator having worked overseas for over 24 years, in seven countries before returning to Canada in 2021, will provide background and context to what Home and School is and does.
- 2. COMPASS Student Health Survey!
