Internet Safety Presentations for students: Like most schools, Eliot River often deals with the fallout of inappropriate internet and social media use by our students during the evenings and weekends. Although there have been many benefits and opportunities created with the advent of the internet, students today are being exposed to a whole new level of pressure from technology and social media. Over the next month, our counsellors (Kirsten Stairs and Angus MacDonald) will again be visiting classes to talk about internet safety and social media use. For the last number of years, we have found these presentations to be very effective in making kids aware of some of the dangers of social media, but also to provide them with appropriate tools to handle situations that are uncomfortable and/or unsafe. When we speak to parents, we often hear that parents are also at a loss of how to handle their child's social media and internet use. We invite you to attend our session for parents (see next item). It is our hope that we can all learn together on how to best support our kids in this digital age.

Internet Safety Parent Presentation: <u>Thursday April 11th. 2024 at 6:30pm</u>. Hosted by our Home and School and facilitated by our school counsellors, this presentation will provide parents with a broad overview of the Internet Safety presentation that is delivered to students, foster an opportunity to discuss challenges that families and children have, and gain some tools on how to address some of those challenges. Our hope is that together we can help our children make safe, healthy and responsible choices when engaging in online behaviours.

This presentation will provide parents with a snapshot of the psychoeducation that is taught to students that deals with the physiological response to emotions. Our hope is that together we can support children when they have challenging emotions by giving them knowledge about what is happening in their bodies, the language to support their understanding, and the tools to help them better regulate their emotions.
